Dear Eberhard:

Gloria Riestra called me this morning, she is very sick.

Tomorrow the declaration of Archbishop Thuc appears in the most important newspaper of Mexico City, it costed 78,450 pesos, over the 405 Dlls. sent generously by you, but Bishop Zamora will give the 13,000 pesos we are short.

Bishop Carmona has asked for a meeting of the american and mexican Bishops at Acapulco, may 17th. As you know, Bishop Carmona with Gloria Riestra, prepared the main points for a collective declaration of the mexican and american Bishops.

Also I tried to talk with Bishop Carmona he comes back tonight to ask him that he invites Bishop Gerard des Lauriers to the meeting, it is the only practical way to have his cooperation.

Also, I talked long distance to Bishop Vezelis asking him to talk with you by phone, since you want to have the document of Archbishop Thuc published in a newspaper at USA.


I donot know if Bishop Carmona has the basic points of the document typed, if he has I am asking him to send a copy to Bishop Gerard des Lauriers and to you.

The public press conference would be at Acapulco, in the Church sacristy, there the Bishops are safe, in their fortress, and Acapulco is an internationallly known city. The plan is to have the document typed and signed, photostated or photocopied, and deliver it to newsmen, asking them to read it, and if they have questions ask them, both american Bishops speak spanish, and Bishop Carmona has a niece that is an official translator in french. I hope Archbishop Thuc can come.

Here, we will have to take care of the reactions to the publication of Archbishop Thuc declaration. We have no money.

After the press conference in Acapulco, of course newspapers will not publish the document complete, if we have money we would publish the document in Excelsior the most important newspaper in this city.
