I hope you do not mind receiving a letter from a stranger. In fact we are not quite strangers since I have been receiving Einsicht for some time. I hope you will not mind my saying that I initially found it sometimes extremely helpful but was dismayed when Einsicht started to promote "Archbishop" Thuc and his followers.

Mr Nicholas Hettinga is paying me a visit in England at the moment and has suggested that I send you the first issue of a publication that we started up earlier this year.
