

# Feast of the Visitation

Dear Mr. Heller,

Recently we recieved two copies of "Einsicht" for which we are grateful. However we are not fluent in the German language and got little instruction from it. We sent some of our writing on the need for electing a Pope to Andre Perlant and he has informed us that he forwarded to you, at least, the summary page of reasons and plans for a papal election.

He said that your goal was the same as ours. Indeed, the very existence of the world depends on the continuation of the Church. We looked for some mention in "Einsicht" of this proposal (to elect a Pope) but found none. We feel that a papal election is so vital that you might devote much of your publication to it.

Perhaps you will say: "Where were you when I was working so hard for a papal election?" We were working with Mr. Fred Dryden when he contacted you in 81 Or 82. Dryden dropped the subject when you got involved with Mgr. Thuc. Andre Perlant has given us your reasons for encouraging these consecrations, though they still seem illicit to us. However we feel that you acted sincerely and from the heart, therefore we ask you to work with us on the election of a Pope. We would hope that the future Pope could be consecrated by a returning, validly consecrated "Councillar bishop" rather than a "Thuc bishop".

Although my family has been promoting this most important project for 10 years, we never got it off the ground. It seems that, as it says in the bible: "There is a time for everything", and Dryden says that when the time is right, things will go well for us. Ten years have gone by and all we have is new divisions and fewer faithful. The time for a papal election was 30 years ago. Now the hour is indeed late. Let us act before the eternal night arrives when no one can work. The visibility of the Church is part of its essence. When it ceases to be visible, it ceases to exist, and the end of the world will be upon us. Our enemies think Christianity is already dead. Let us prove it is not so.

My idea is that someone in each country will call its Catholics together (however few they may be) and prepare to send delegates to an international meeting (Conventus Imperfectus). This will be, I think, most efficient and will not require any international executive. No one can assume power or authority in the Church when it is without a Vicar of Christ. We will, of course, elect officers to maintain order at the "Conventus Imperfectus". Then, hopefully we will vote or appoint a time for the Conclave.

Carmona seems to belong to the enemy camp.  
Zamora may have been alright.
