Dear Doctor Heller,

Very many thanks for your letter of 5.12.85. It was so nice to hear from you. It is never too late!

I am writing to you primarily to point out an error. You already sent me the autobiography of Fr. Ngo-dinh-Thuc. I will send this back to you in the new year - after the Christmas rush! You sent it to me about a year ago.

I will pass on the Einsicht to a friend, if that is alright. At the moment I am not in a position to take out a subscription to Einsicht. I have not worked for nearly 6 years. I already get Fr. Jones' magazine and Fr. McKenna's from the USA, so don't have a great deal to spare. However, if I do become in a position to take out a sub., and you are lucky enough to find some good translators, would it be OK, if I sent you the sub. in English currency ~~notes~~ notes rather than a cheque? Or would you prefer German notes?

On the matter of translation, I am afraid I do not have very much German, although I do have some French, if that is any help. If so please let me know, as I am anxious to help.

Enclose a photocopy of an article from a magazine, about Mgr. Thuc. The editor is a traditional Catholic (whether sede vacantist I don't know). The magazine is about financial reform (social credit) and the banking swindle. I wrote to the editor shortly after Mgr. Thuc died - although, as you can see, I got the date wrong.

I know both Fr. Baker and Mr. Howson. I have met Fr. Baker a number of times, but never Mr. Howson. Fr. Baker is one of only 2 sede vacantist priests in Britain, which are the only ones I will attend

so I have been to Downham Market 3 times. Due to distance and expense, I usually only get there once a year, as I have to go by train.

I will close now. Was it not sad to hear of the death of Bishop Altenbach? I will pray for him and for Archbishop Thuc. I will also pray for you Dr. Heller, and for the success of your work. Please remember me in your prayers.
